



MASKS & FACE COVERINGS: The Legalities, Realities, and Moralities of Where We Stand

What a week it has been in county government! On Friday, January 7, the County Council did not receive the necessary votes (5) to extend the emergency order for indoor masking in the county. Therefore, it expired on January 7 at 12pm. HOWEVER, our County Health Official instituted a public health order immediately following the Council meeting, calling for indoor masking beginning at 5pm on January 7.

There is a LOT of confusion out there. Who is right, who is wrong, what can they do, and what should they do? There are council members and state representatives claiming the public health order is invalid and illegal. There are others who are relieved that masking is required. So where does the church fit into all of this? We are an "indoor public gathering" by definition. Do we mask, do we unmask? We know we are to submit to governing authorities, but what happens when those governing authorities do not agree with one another?

I have been privileged to be a part of some of the difficult conversations going on in our government concerning "best practices" during the pandemic. Many times I was invited into these conversations. Many times, I invited myself. You also know that by way of personal opinion, I am not "in favor" of a masking mandate. HOWEVER - As a church, we will continue to abide by the request of County Government, and follow the masking mandate put in place by the County Health Official on January 7, 2022. If such a time comes that those in disagreement with this mandate can show that it is illegal or invalid though litigation, we will revisit this issue.

As I mentioned in my sermon on January 2, one "right" we do not have as Christians is the right-of-refusal for a request from authority, even an unreasonable request. I would encourage everyone to be a part of your civic process — be a good constituent and make your voice heard. But in the meantime, we MUST err on the side of grace. As important as our government processes are, and as much as we should be involved in them, THEY ARE NOT THE MOST IMPORTANT THING. The most important thing is the furtherance of the Gospel, and our role in that as a church. And we can continue that mission with or without masks on.

So whether you are in agreement with the current situation or not, make your voice heard – show up at Town Halls and Council Meetings – step up and be a part of the process. These are all good things.

And for now, when you come to church, wear your mask.
